A BRIEF HISTORY OF FRANKLIN SQUARE

The following was published in "The Connection", May 1990.

The village of Franklin Square is situated on the Northeast corner of Section 22 of Salem Township and was entered by Conrad Bennett who later sold his holdings to Frederick Best. Mr. Best, plotted the village and later had it recorded at New Lisbon on June 5, 1829. This was officially the beginning of Franklin Square. It is 100 years old this summer. Salem Township began to be settled in 1803, but it is recorded that in 1805 there were only three houses on the road between New Lisbon and Canfield, one of which was a very small log cabin near the creek north of what is now Franklin Square. (Gr. Grandma Bradbury's house?)

This village was incorporated by act of the Legislature passed Jan. 10, 1843, but there is no record of any elected village officers. A post office was established here in 1834. Some of the postmasters were: Charles Budd, Daniel Robinson, David Snyder and John DeRhodes.

Located at a junction of North-South, East-West highways, the one leading from Wheeling, W. Va., via Steubenville and New Lisbon, to Ashtabula Harbor on Lake Erie, the other leading from Pittsburgh, Pa. to Canton, Ohio, both of which were stage and freight routes, Franklin Square was the prosperous and thriving center of a large community and its population and activities compared favorably with other towns of Columbiana County. In 1840 the population was 141. In those days the streams were larger than they are now, due to the prevalence of large forested areas, and the Middle Fork of Beaver Creek with its tributaries afforded fine water power for several flour mills and saw mills. It was planned by some enterprising citizens to build a canal to the

Sandy & Beaver Canal, north of New Lisbon, and a charter was taken out for this purpose in 1835-36, but work never actually begun.

Among the several mills located in the neighborhood, one of the largest was the "Amity", located about a mile northeast of the village on the road to Salem. It was a stone structure, built by Jonathan Fawcett in 1841. It was forty by sixty-one feet, and was five and one-half stories high counting the basement. The foundation walls were twenty-five feet below the level of the road and four feet thick for the first twelve feet of height, then three feet, and finally two feet at the top. James Stamp, a millwright and a resident of the community placed the machinery. Directly back of this mill was a flaxseed oil mill at an earlier date.

In 1836 the Methodist Church built a frame structure on a knoll just back of the present church edifice; also, a brick school house was built the same year on a lot diagonally opposite the present church building. It is probable that the bricks for that schoolhouse and also for the brick building, which still stands, were made in the local brickyard which was located on the Marshall farm south of the Erie Railroad tracks.

Henry Dixon was the first storekeeper here, and was located in the brick building referred to above. Frederick Best carried on an extensive tannery in the early days of the settlement. This tannery was later conducted by Mr. Phillips. Among the other business interests were cooper shops, 2 wagon shops, a dry goods store, a drug store, a shoe shop and two or three blacksmith shops, which were always busy. Children going home from school could look in at the open door of the village smithy. There was also a good sized hotel which was usually filled with guests.

Some of the business men from 1830 to 1840 were:

Blacksmiths: Jacob Marshall, John Ritter & James DePew

Wagonmakers: Andrew Amos, Joseph Marshall & Asa Holloway

Coopers: John Albright, Sr. & J.C. Frederick

Hotelkeepers: Aaron Sinclair & David Rovinson

Shoemakers: Thomas Mackelwe, Charles Hedings & Jacob Estill

Grain cradles were manufactured by Joseph Entrikin and later by John DeRhodes. Dr. Andrews was the first practicing physician, probably in the thirties. Dr. Allen followed him and after 16 years moved. Dr. Jacob Burger succeeded him and had a large practice covering about fifty years.

When the clouds of war loomed high on the political horizon in '61, there were many from this

community who answered their country's call. Some gave their lives and all did valiant service that there might be guaranteed to us and our posterity.

And on this hundredth anniversary of the found of this village, let us pause a moment to look back with veneration and just pride to those hearty pioneers who had their part in that great army of empire builders who pushed back the wilderness and built their sturdy character into the foundations of the greatest and best of all countries -- America.

FOR \$100 A MAN SELLS HIS WIFE AND CHILDREN, THEN HE LEAVES FOR HIS NATIVE COUNTRY ACROSS THE SEA SINGULAR TRANSACTION THAT TOOK PLACE AT BELOIT

A singular affair, authenticated beyond question, comes to us from Beloit. It is nothing more nor less than the sale of a wife and several children, by the husband and father for \$100. The facts appear to be as follows: JACOB ZELLER, aged about 50, is a native of Switzerland. He came to this country a number of years ago, bringing with him a second wife. The pair have five or six children, their ages ranging from two to twelve years. The other party in question in BRECHT YENNEY, a cheese maker, who is employed in a factory near Beloit. Brecht is a single man and has some property. ZELLER has not been thrifty and is without means.

A year ago last spring ZELLER and YENNE, in partnership, rented the Allison farm near Beloit, and worked it together. The partnership was dissolved on the first of last April. 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
